Becky's research is led by an inquiry into new creative circular models for the textile and fashion industries. She has pioneered circular textiles at UAL for over 25 years and uses her research to leverage the role of design in the transition to a creative economy in international networks. Her methods are practice-informed, expert workshop facilitation and creative storytelling for a wide range of stakeholders and audiences – from school children through to scientists and policy makers.

Between 2011 - 2017 Becky was director of Textile Futures Research Centre **(TFRC)**, based at Central Saint Martins, where a community of textile design researchers spanning CSM and Chelsea explored technology, wellbeing & sustainability. From 1996, Becky taught textiles at Chelsea & from 1999 she led projects with Kay Politowicz for the Textiles Environment Design (TED) group. TED transitioned after 20 years into CCD, having achieved its goal - firmly

establishing **The TEN** as a recognised framework of design approaches used in both academia & industry. Centre for Circular Design **(CCD)** enabled Becky & Kate Goldsworthy to create a research centre focused on circular textiles for fashion. Over a five year period (2017 - 2022) Becky was a co-/lead on three large EU based/funded projects: **Mistra Future Fashion II, Trash-2-Cash** & **Herewear.**
